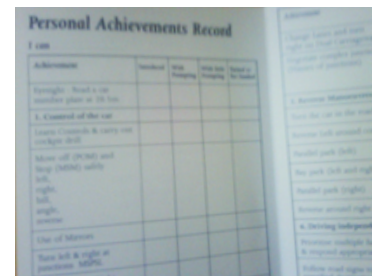
## Driving lessons

We teach in both Manual and Automatic cars so if you are not suited to one method and want to try the other that can be arranged easily. The cars are dual controlled and have air conditioning and power steering and fully adjustable seats to keep you as safe and comfortable as possible.

The instructors are flexible and friendly and committed to helping you learn to drive. They all speak clear English and are experienced at helping individuals who do not have English as their first language. Our Instructors are experienced and proud of their high pass rates.

All Learners are taught using a logical structured process that builds on their previous knowledge and experience. At Freeway we like to conduct regular assessments to confirm current development and adapt training accordingly.



Beginners are taken through a step-by-step guide that is entered on their pupil record to track progress and assess readiness for test. New novice drivers (those with existing experience) are assessed against driving test standards to identify areas for further development and bespoke training is applied accordingly.

A little before the scheduled driving test, pupils are taken on a mock test with a different driving instructor to simulate the exam. Faults are recorded on a driving test report form and the results are analysed together to formulate further training if necessary.

Test Assessment lessons are given to Learners with previous experience who feel they are ready to take their test. The learner is taken on a typical test route and assessed as they would be were it an actual driving test. An action plan of further training or practice needed is then developed to prepare for the real test.

Lessons can be started from your home or place of work/college at a time convenient to you and rearranged accordingly.



Beginners are encouraged to take double or long weekly lessons to start with to make the most of the time

available. (Initially your instructor will drive you to and from a suitable training site.) Novice drivers often find long or even single lessons more convenient and some times increase their frequency to two or more lessons a week. Before test, lessons are often arranged at different times of the day to expand experience of driving at busier times or at night.

Intensive courses are usually available and include test fees, though you'll need to have passed your theory test first.

Theory training is woven in to practical lessons so pupils not only learn the answers but remember them too! You will be taught to protect vulnerable road users like pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders by understanding their special needs, giving them space and passing them safely. Defensive driving is taught as standard – looking out for the speeding motorcyclist behind, the hurrying taxi pulling out of the side road, the elderly driver not noticing the mini roundabout, and all the other hazards accepted as everyday driving. Passing the driving test is par for the course.
